**CONFESSIONS OF A BUTTERFLY** described by St John Paul II as a "a symbol of true religion and true morality for the world today", Janusz Korczak is a national hero in Poland & has a huge following around the world, though little known in the UK. A prolific writer, he was first person to understand that children have rights equal to those of adults: he ran two orphanages in Warsaw, one for Catholics & one for Jews. In World War II he was forced into the Warsaw Ghetto with 200 children before being murdered with them in Treblinka in 1942.

Jonathan Salt wrote the play, *Confessions of a Butterfly*, and is performing it this August in Edinburgh at the Fringe. He is currently in rehearsals and is putting on a rehearsed script-reading in the GS Room on **Friday 28<sup>th</sup> June** at 19.30 with a Q & A afterwards. Tickets are limited and cost £5.
